





Ray A. Newton is the President and Chairman of the Board of Brown Chapel Cemetery Association, Inc. (BCCA, Inc.) in Hallettsville Texas.

As President, Ray leads a diverse management team that is working to deliver BCCA's vision of "restoring the value and legacy of our ancestors through cemetery restoration." Under his leadership, BCCA has implemented the "it factor", inclusion and transparency, which creates an environment that encourages collaboration, communication, and empowerment. Region and is currently an Executive Officer and Project Manager.
